



FEI WORLD CUP™ DRESSAGE

FACTS & FIGURES

- Top fashion designer, Reem Acra, recently signed a three-year sponsorship deal for the western European league and Final of the FEI World Cup™ Dressage series beginning with the 2010/2011 season
- FEI World Cup™ Dressage celebrates its 26th season during the 2010/2011 series
- Gal's victory in s'Hertogenbosch (NED) in 2010 was the tenth Dutch success in the history of the series
- The first-ever winner of the FEI World Cup™ Dressage series was Denmark's Anne-Grethe Jensen, riding Marzog
- The most successful rider in the history of FEI World Cup™ Dressage is The Netherlands' Anky Van Grunsven who claimed the title nine times over a 13 year period stretching from 1995 to 2008 and riding only two horses - Bonfire and Salinero
- Isabel Werth became the youngest ever winner of the FEI World Cup™ Final in 1992 at age 23. She remains the youngest rider to have won the prestigious title followed by Sven Rothenberger aged 24 in 1991 and Anky Van Grunsven aged 27 in 1995
- Salinero and Totilas were only 10 years of age when they won the FEI World Cup™ Finals in 2004 and 2010 respectively
- Only three stallions have ever won the FEI World Cup™ Dressage Final: Gauguin de Lully in 1987 and 1988, Matador in 1991 and Totilas in 2010
- Mares have also been rare on the top step of the FEI World Cup™ podium: Fabienne (1992) and Brentina (2003)
- The first rider to break the 80% barrier was Monica Theodorescu riding Ganimedes - producing back to back wins in 1993 and 1994
